Course Description:

Concert/Performance Dress Code:

Grading Policy:

Grading will be broken down as follows:

- A. 30% Daily Work
 - a. With any performance-based class, being present and participating is a must.
 - b. Participation means showing me that you grasp the concepts being worked on and progress on the music being prepared through participation.
 - c. This could include written work such as concert critiques etc...
- B. 20% Small Group Work/Lessons
 - a. You will be required to do 1 concert critique a semester.
 - b. You will be required to perform in a small group this year.
 - c. 2 lessons will be required each semester.
- C. 25% Scales/playing tests/Assessments
 - a. You will be assessed on current music and scales throughout the year.
 - b. You will also be assessed on music theory etc...
- D. 25% Concerts/Performances
 - a. These really are one of the main assessments you will have in the semester. You must be present for the concert at the end of the semester, large group contest, and graduation.
 - b. If you miss for a legitimate reason (This will be determined by your parents and myself), a makeup assignment will be available to you.
 - c. Pep Band is a required performance.
